Believer's Youth Camp Rules

It is expedient that all camp rules be obeyed to prevent being dismissed from camp!

- 1.) Each camper planning to stay at the camp must register prior to going to the designated dorm.
- 2.) If any damages do occur, the responsible party must pay the repairs!
- 3.) Campers are expected to keep their rooms clean and personal belongings in order.
- 4.) Campers are required to attend all services and all scheduled activities.
- 5.) All medication must be checked in at time of registration for the nurse's record.
- 6.) Everyone shall wear shoes while on the grounds. According to the campground's insurance, flip flops and shower shoes are not considered shoes.
- 7.) No camper person is to leave grounds without properly notifying the staff and such permission being granted.
- 8.) "Modesty & Humility" are the key words in dress and deed.
 - Brothers: keep sweat pants in the cabins, not out in public. Also, no skinny jeans or holey jeans.
 - Sisters: please have modest sleeves and necklines. No slacks. No tight, clingy, or form fitting skirts/dresses. No sheer/see through clothing. No skirts or dresses with splits. If you must wear leggings they must be shorter than the length of your skirt/dress; which should in all situations come below the knee.
- 9.) Campers are required to be in their cabins, devotions completed and quiet by 11:00pm. (Except for the Holy Spirit working)
- 10.) All cell phones, tablets, etc. must be turned off during service times. They will be turned over to dorm leaders at curfew time and locked up.**
- 11.) Please do not post photos to social media during the week of camp.
- 12.) Campers must remain in central camp areas and may not travel to the cabin or RV areas except by special permission from the staff.**
- 13.) Campers are not to stay in cottages or RV's.**
- 14.) No camper is allowed outside of sleeping areas after lights out.
- 15.) It is your responsibility to take personal belongings home. Items left behind will not be returned.
- 16.) Campers 13 and under MUST attend the younger tabernacle. No exceptions.**
- 17.) All vehicles must be registered for identification purposes.

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Assumption of the Risk and Waiver of Liability Relating to Coronavirus/COVID-19

The novel coronavirus, COVID-19, has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization. COVID-19 is extremely contagious and is believed to spread mainly from person-to-person contact. As a result, federal, state, and local governments and federal and state health agencies recommend social distancing and have, in many locations, prohibited the congregation of groups of people.

Believer's Youth Camp ("BYC") has put in place preventative measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19, adhering to the guidelines provided to BYC by the Health Department of the State of Indiana; however, BYC cannot guarantee that you or your child(ren) will not become infected with COVID-19. Further, attending BYC could increase your risk and your child(ren)'s risk of contracting COVID-19. By signing this agreement, I acknowledge the contagious nature of COVID-19 and voluntarily assume the risk that my child(ren) and I may be exposed to or infected by COVID-19 by attending BYC and that such exposure or infection may result in personal injury, illness, permanent disability, and death. I understand that the risk of becoming exposed to or infected by COVID-19 at BYC may result from the actions, omissions, or negligence of myself and others, including, but not limited to, BYC staff members, campground volunteers, and program participants and their families.

I voluntarily agree to assume all of the foregoing risks and accept sole responsibility for any injury to my child(ren) or myself (including, but not limited to, personal injury, disability, and death), illness, damage, loss, claim, liability, or expense, of any kind, that I or my child(ren) may experience or incur in connection with my child(ren)'s attendance at BYC or participation in BYC programming ("Claims".) On my behalf, and on behalf of my children, I hereby release, covenant not to sue, discharge, and hold harmless BYC, its employees, agents, and representatives, of and from the Claims, including all liabilities, actions, damages, costs or expenses of any kind arising out of or relating thereto. I understand and agree that this release includes any Claims based on the actions, omissions, or negligence of BYC, its employees, agents, and representatives, whether a COVID-19 infection occurs before, during, or after participation in any BYC program.
